I often feel a little sad at this time of year as the summer is drawing to a close, but September does bring with it a new start, a new term for schools, colleges and universities, and although the Church New Year is still a little way off (at Advent), September often brings renewed activity after a slightly quieter summer. I am of course talking of more “normal” years! September although being a time of exciting new beginnings, can also be a time of anxiety as students, for example, move up to a new class, school or leave home for the first time to study at college or university. That going forward to something new and unknown can bring worry - the worry of uncertainty as we leave the familiar behind, and that anxiety is something we all probably suffer to some extent presently.
